



The BSRA Annual Recording weekend and AGM will be held in Scarborough, North Yorkshire from Friday 15th May to Sunday 17th May.



The base for this year's weekend is the Palm Court Hotel Commanding a wonderful central position, the comfortable Palm Court Hotel boasts one of the most prestigious locations in Scarborough. Set against a backdrop of beautiful heritage coastline, the hotel venue offers an invigorating experience in all seasons.

Events will commence on Friday evening with a visit to the famous Scarborough Fair Collection. We meet for a private tour of the collection of fairground organs, steam engines, vintage cars and many other items from a bygone age. We will then proceed into the auditorium for a recording session and mini concert with our host Kevin Grunill. This year we have a chance to record the Mighty Wurlitzer, not one but two fantastic instruments. During the evening a delicious traditional Yorkshire supper will be served.

On Saturday afternoon we will join the team at the North Bay Railway for a tour of the facilities and a ride aboard one of their superb trains. We may also take in a coastal Cruise aboard the beautiful Corona or one of her sister ships.

On Saturday evening we have booked the Palm Court Hotel's restaurant for an informal dinner and chance to socialise.

Following a leisurely breakfast on Sunday, we have arranged a visit to one of the coasts many attractions.



The Bretton Birds of Prey Centre was established in 2003 to facilitate in the awareness of our local wildlife. The facility offers educational and awareness on the eagle, owls, hawks and falcons kept at the Centre for the public to enjoy. Visitors are encouraged to visit the centre and see the birds at first hand and be given enjoyable and informative talks about the birds, their habits and habitats as well as their environmental significance. We will have a private guided tour of the facility and then out to the Flying Field for the opportunity to see the birds in action.

Lunch is available in the hotel restaurant and this can be followed by a visit to the Great Yorkshire Moors Railway if numbers are sufficient.
